MARKS OF A MISSION FIELD

throughout the season of Lent, we have been reflecting on 14 marks of a Mission Field that foster disciples. These marks have been handed on to our Diocese by the Holy Spirit through the gift of Bishop Daniel. Each "mark" is meant to be an examination on how we as Mission Fields are bearing abundant fruit and where we may need to trim away dead branches to grow even more.

Over the first weekend in Lent, we reflected on Krygma, Encounter and Healing. Every Mission Field in our Diocese is called to preach and share the Krygma at every Mass, every funeral, every wedding, every meeting, every gathering, every class. We must always be proclaiming that God the Father created us good, yet we chose sin and broke off our relationship with Him. Then, in God's goodness, He chose to send His Son Jesus Christ to save us. Finally, the Holy Spirit was sent so we might be on Mission. When these foundational truths are proclaimed and heard throughout Our Mission Field, people will begin encountering the person of Jesus Christ and the power of the Holy Spirit. This will lead to healing between communities, in families, in parishes, in individuals and in all corners of Our Mission Field.

The next weekend we reflected on Sacramental Grace and Liturgy. The most primary place we encounter Christ is in the seven Sacraments of the Church. Every Mass in Our Mission Field should be a place of encounter. From the joy and friendliness of the Ushers, to the deeply anointed and beautiful music, to the reverence in the way Mass is prayed, to the fellowship of parishioners sharing life together afterwards. A fruitful Mission Field also has Baptisms and Weddings happening regularly, with the whole parish celebrating and welcoming these new families into the Church. There are also large lines for confessions and people receiving the Anointing of the Sick often. A healthy Mission Field is producing young men and women who are giving their lives away to religious vocations, and finally a fruitful Mission Field has people converting and entering the fullness of our Catholic life every year.





Over the third weekend of Lent, we examined how a healthy Mission Field is Open to the Holy Spirit, is committed to People over Programs and is trying to reach All People at all Stages of Faith. This means as individuals and as parishes we are open to transformation and to being flexible to moving in the moment if the mission requires it. We are also deeply committed to encountering one another and walking with one another. This is always more important than our schedules, calendars and programs. Finally, a healthy Mission Field is strategic and intentional at meeting people of all ages and stages of Faith. Realizing that not all things work for all people, and that the Mission Field must be creative and intentional about the ways they reach out to all people.

The next "marks" we considered were celebration, families and unity. A healthy and holy Mission Field is a place of celebration. People, groups, and parishes live a culture of gratitude and celebration. There is little complaining and negativity, rather it a culture that looks to celebrate and sees all the good that God is doing in and through the community. The people gather often with joy and gratitude. From this attitude of celebration, families are attracted to the Mission Field and soon there is a deep sense of unity. Celebration brings unity, while negativity beings disunity never allowing the community grow or celebrate.

The last three marks that were spoken about were community, collaboration and abundance. A fruitful mission field will never let fear be the driving force and there is never a mindset of scarcity, but rather, abundance. There is trust that God will always provide. This way of living and thinking will bring about the gift of collaboration which means that while we understand each parish in the Mission Field is unique, there is collaboration rather than competition with other parishes and community organizations, recognizing that through working together even greater fruit can be brought about in the community.

As we enter this Holy Week and Easter, let's pray that we all may continue to strive to live these "marks" and to fight against those attitudes and things that prevent these fourteen marks from being lived day in and day out. May the Holy Spriit bring about these graces, so that in the days ahead we can experience the joy and power of the Holy Spirit just as the early Church did in the Acts of the Apostles!
