
Eucharistic Revival Night #3 at Holy Spirit

Priest's Corner

I had an occasion recently to be in a Church here in the Mission Field for a Sunday Mass. It was twenty minutes before the start, and there was nobody there. It was me, Jesus in the Tabernacle and of course many angels surrounding us. I was flabbergasted. The first people that showed up 2 minutes later actually asked me, "Is there Mass tonight?" The lights were on, the candles lit, the gifts in their place on the stand in back, but the lack of faithful people caused doubt for them and me. I said "yes." With no time left there gathered a small crowd in the final minutes and ten more after Mass began. My perplexity caused the Holy Spirit to move and I gave two homilies.

I told them a story about how just that week I went to a Wild game in St. Paul. I had three tickets and the original group intending to go changed, so I had to fill the third spot. The original plan was to stay at my sister's in Robbinsdale on Sunday night, which I did. On Monday, I had to drive north again and pick up a woman in Moose Lake who would fill that third spot. She was in her 70's, and I took it upon myself to alleviate her drive. I went from Robbinsdale to Moose Lake, then to Hastings to pick up the other, and to St. Paul for the game. At the game 95% of the people were already there early. We took our seats. The Wild won 3-1. We left one minute early to get a jump in the parking ramp. 95% of the people stayed in the arena, and instead of taking an extra 45 minutes to get out of the parking lot, we escaped immediately. Off to Hastings to drop off the first, then to Moose Lake to drop off the second, and finally by 1:30 am I arrived in Proctor to sleep at my mother's home. I clocked my time driving, 8 hours... one day. For a Wild game.

Why is it that if we can arrive early and stay late for something as meaningless as a hockey game, is there a lack of wisdom and understanding about the worship of the living and true God? In places as remote to us as Africa, the faithful walk for hours to go to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, and in many villages the Mass takes hours...not 50 minutes (or so). Get in, get out, and go to and from the Mass. This to me has always been disconcerting. I am a champion of making preparation before Mass, and pausing at the end to make thanksgiving. Faith, belief, and meaning is reflected by our actions. What is in your heart (love for Jesus) is demonstrated by living it on the outside. What better time spent? What faith lived and demonstrated to others than the witness of the hard truth that God is God and I am not. I need Him, I want to be around Him. My routine can be broken by a greater truth.

There was a Catholic Church in Willow River (that has since been closed) where all the faithful stayed in the Church at the end. They fell down on their knees together and prayed privately. Prayers of thanksgiving to the God who filled them with the Bread of Life. I have never seen anything like it in all my years as a Catholic. Such witness for visitors to that parish. I dream of that reality in the Mission Field. I also note that in my tour of Masses and locations here, there are only two Sunday Masses, and no Saturday Masses, where the rosary in prayed before the Mass publicly. I think we have to work on that...I really do.

Search your heart, amend your routine, express your faith, follow the Holy Spirit. Nothing is more meaningful than the Mass.
