# Darkness to Light by Father David Forsman

In a continuation from last week's column on FACE or Flexible, Adaptable, Creative and Enthusiastic, I submit the following. First, living by this model in all areas of your life would be nearly impossible for the eternal pessimist. One would have to have some foresight to positive outcomes in life and not see negative outcomes only. If you are closed off to grace, you will not receive grace. That is another way of putting it. For FACE to work for you, you have to be open to change, a positive direction in light of large and minute experiences.

Let's take an example. You have lived in your house and home for 40 years. You can't do it anymore and it is apparent to everyone that you can't do it anymore and must go to a Nursing Home. You dread the thought of your loss of freedom. You dread having to live with others and the thought of being interrupted with a whole new way of life. You know others in Nursing Homes and you don't want your reality to be that reality. You aren't ready for this. And so think about **FACE**.

To be flexible means to own the fact that this is the best decision, more than likely the best decision and that you can't care for yourself or your home. Bending to the truth is most positive and will bear good fruit.

To be adaptable means here that you believe it will work out for you. That millions and millions of people live in Nursing Homes and Assisted Living places should help you to adapt to the thought that "this is doable" and "I can do this". You have faced many challenges in life, this one won't be so bad because you won't be alone. Adapting to the truth that life will be more manageable for you with the assistance of nursing staff, food services and cleaning staff. Yes it will be smaller, but can you adapt to the truth about how much space you really need.

This is where creative comes in this situation. I go into many Nursing Home rooms and am amazed at the creative ways that people bring into their rooms the most important, impressive things from their lives. How I can walk around and initiate conversation about those things and get a sense of who the person is. You can recreate your home by creatively decorating your new space, something that most people enjoy.

Finally, enthusiastic I think speaks also to your attitude. You can be enthusiastic about meeting new people or joining old friends. You can be enthusiastic about letting go of some of your worries about falling or preparing meals, driving dangers or taking your meds appropriately. Tell yourself, this is going to be a good thing for me and embrace the truth of the situation. This idea of being enthusiastic may be the hardest one but it is your attitude that governs feeling and ultimately actions.

Next week I will build out from this example into the realm of the spiritual life. The spiritual life contains many pitfalls and barriers. With the motto **FACE** you will be able to examine and adjust what you are doing or doing wrong and bear much fruit.


